About Podiatric Surgery

Podiatric Surgery specialises in the assessment and surgical management of complex foot disorders including forefoot, mid foot and rear foot pathologies. Treatment is carried out by podiatric surgeons and in the case of Park House Health and Social Care Centre, Carlton, Nottingham, all surgery is performed under local anaesthesia.

Podiatric Surgeons are specialists in foot surgery, regulated by the HCPC (Health and Care Professions Council) and governed by the College of Podiatrists, Faculty of Surgery. The majority of work undertaken is elective forefoot surgery.

Lancel Hogg

Lance Hogg obtained Fellowship in Podiatric Surgery in 1993. He has been treating patients with foot problems since 1985 and has 13 years experience at Consultant level in the surgical management of foot pain and deformity. He trained in Luton, Seattle and San Antonio, Texas.

Anthony Maher

Anthony qualified as a podiatrist in 2000 from the University of Brighton and subsequently undertook surgical training in the West Midlands, Ilkeston and most recently Doncaster. Additional specialist training has taken him to the USA. Anthony has a keen interest in evidence based practice and has published a number of papers



evaluating surgical outcomes, he is currently working with the Society of Chiropractors and Podiatrists to develop PASCOM which is a national audit tool for monitoring patient outcomes in podiatry.

What services do we offer?

The department's primary role is the provision of day care elective foot surgery under local anaesthesia, with a focus on patient safety and satisfaction. However we also offer a number of other treatments including;

- Cortisone injections
- Immobilisation therapies
- Physical therapies
- Foot health advice

We also work closely with our colleagues in the Musculoskeletal Podiatry team who offer custom made foot orthoses.

Common diagnoses we treat:

- Hallux valgus
- Hallux rigidus
- Claw / hammer toes
- Neuroma / nerve entrapment
- Metatarsalgia
- Soft tissue lumps and bumps
- Degenerative arthritis
- Tendon disorders
- Keratotic disorders of the skin

*Please note in-growing toe nails and plantar fasciitis are managed by the community podiatry team.

Helpful hint;

If you are referring a patient for treatment of hallux valgus or hallux rigidus, sending the patient for standard weight bearing DP and lateral foot x-rays prior to the referral will allow us to complete our surgical assessment in a single visit to Park House.
