

Epilepsy Transition and Handover Pathway

SFH CYP Board, Jan 2020

Paediatrics consider once 16 year and over.

Handover complete when appropriate for the young person

Hospital based care

Adult Epilepsy Specialist Nurse, can see any young person in nurse-led clinic as part of ongoing paediatric care. The Adult transition nurse-led clinic runs parallel to Dr Dunkley's YP Epilepsy Clinic . Will aim to automatically see young person with epilepsy from 16 years and over .

School/Community based care

LD Epilepsy Specialist Nurse can see any young person with epilepsy >16 years and LD in ad hoc way as requested. Could be within paediatric clinic, special school, stand alone review.

Write to Lisa Flinton

Has the young person had any seizures in the last 12 months?

'Seizure freedom' for >12 months

Seizure(s) in last 12 months

Discharge handover to GP

Request GP to

- ensure ongoing review at least yearly
- refer to Epilepsy adult neurology if any future concern eg seizures, prepregnancy planning, AED problems.
- 3 Yearly bloods (Vit D, TFT, U&E, FBC, LFTs if on CBZ, VP or phenytoin
- Signpost to Epilepsy Action, Epilepsy Society

2 or less AEDs tried

to General Adult
Neurology (KMH or
Newark) via MDS
Paediatrics support in
meantime if problems

3 or more AEDs tried OR Woman on Valproate

to Epilepsy Adult
Neurology (KMH or
Newark) (eg Drs Lim,
Giavasi, Singhal) via MDS.
Sometimes they will see
in NUH first.
Paediatrics support in
meantime if problems

Consider parallel referrals for all other associated problems
